Flinders Netball Club is committed to the recruitment and development of volunteer netball coaches. To help you become part of our coaching team, please refer to the following frequently asked questions.

How do I become a Netball Coach for Flinders Netball Club?

Email the Club via flindersnetballclub@qmail.com with your expression of interest. Please

include:

- 1. Full name and contact details
- 2. List any previous coaching experience (experience not necessary)
- 3. Include any current Netball Queensland Coaching accreditation held
- 4. Age group preference
- 5. Blue Card Status (if over 18 years)

I don't have any coaching accreditation. Can I still apply to coach?

Yes. However, you will have to complete the Australian Sports Commission "General Principles of Coaching" online. The course is free and takes a very short time to complete. In addition, all our coaches now require a Level 1 Foundation Coaching Accreditation from Netball Qld. This course is now available wholly online at a cost of \$65, which will be reimbursed by the Club upon emailing of the Foundation Certificate to flindersnetballclub@gmail.com. It is a requirement of all prospective coaches to complete these before commencing coaching a team.

What else will I need to do?

New coaches will be required to attend a "Coach the Coach" training session run by The Flinders Netball Club Head Coach (Vickey Frost) and the Senior Coaching Unit (SCU). This will be held on a date to be announced.

Our senior coaching group will offer advice on; 1.

- 1. Planning for training sessions
- 2. Skill development and corrections
- 3. Team drills and positional play
- 4. Player management

What is Flinders Netball Club doing to promote excellence in coaching?

Successful development of players comes from a strong grounding in the basic skills from an early age. To achieve this our coaches must be fully trained to teach the basic skills proficiently. Therefore, from 2018 Flinders Netball Club have strongly encouraged all coaches to complete the second level of Netball Qld Coaching Accreditation – Development Level. This course is in 2 parts, an online component and a 'face to face' component, at a cost of \$131.48, again this will be reimbursed by the Club upon emailing of the Development Level Certificate to flindersnetballclub@gmail.com.

I'm still a student at Flinders and I want to coach a team with one of my friends. Is this possible?

Flinders Netball Club promotes junior coach development and previous coaching experience, along with skill level and current coaching accreditation will be considered when assessing junior coaches. However, all Junior coaches will be 'buddied up' with an adult coach wherever possible.
